

Paterno Liberal Arts Undergraduate Fellows in Crime, Law, and Justice

Liberal Arts Academic Fellows who major in Crime, Law, and Justice are required to take a capstone course in their junior or senior year, along with the general program requirements. The topic of the course will vary with the instructor, but it will address issues in criminology, criminal justice, policy, and research methods. Students in this course will be required to write a research paper.

Students seeking to become Liberal Arts Fellows in Crime, Law and Justice are required to take CRIM012, CRIM100, STAT200, and CRIM250W by the end of their sophomore year. They must have achieved at least a 3.7 GPA in these courses.
